From The Head Teacher

Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back! A special word of welcome to our new recruits in Year 7 and our returning glorious Year 12s after their terrific set of results in the summer. The GCSE results of St Joseph's are among the top 5% in the country for Progress of all schools and the A Level Results are amongst the top 10% in the country of all schools and post 16 institutions in terms of progress. We saw a record number of students going on to study Law and Medicine including Cambridge University and a record number going to Russell Group Universities. Congratulations to them and to all the parents and guardians who deserve every word possible of praise for their encouragement and support.

Return to school

The latest update of government deadlines last Friday posed some extra logistics for us and it became apparent we were going to have to allow some time for the year groups to know new routines before we get the entire school back together as a whole. So, to clarify the return to school is (as it was on the letter sent out last week) for returning years is as follows:

Monday Years 8 & 9 only (and Year 7 EHCP)

Tuesday Years 10 &11 only

Wednesday All years in (including Year 13)

If you have any questions around the schedule please don't hesitate to phone us.

Measures are we putting in place to prevent the spread of Covid.

The measures we have put into place to prevent the spread of Covid are laid out in a document called 'Continuing Education: September Opening Arrangements 2020-21' which is on our website. This document also outlines planning in the event of a local Tier setting by the Local Authority or National Government partial/ full lockdown scenario. We're planning on opening up more entrances and exits to the school for specific Year groups but given the timing of the guidelines these are subject to approved risk assessments. It follows that this document is likely to be updated over the first week - we'll let you know when that happens by email.

Uniform

I know that although the children might leave home in a pristine condition before school, sometimes by the time they have arrived there may have made a few alterations to their appearances. Can I ask you to remind the children about the following uniform policy. Thanks in advance.

- Skirts knee length
- No varnished nails, acrylic or shellac gel nails.
- Shoes to be worn.
- No trainers, hoodies or scarves other than blue /black solid colours
- Ear rings simple studs only (in the lobe)
- No make up
- No extreme haircuts/ shaved eyebrows
- PE: Students who have PE will need to come in their PE kit on the day as there are restrictions around the proximity of students in the changing rooms. Tracksuits are allowed for those coming into school on these occasions.

Or will that annoyance remain ingrained in your head? The key to improving any relationship is to **listen.** You might be surprised at what this person has to say.

Make an effort this week to find someone who has wronged you. **Listen** to what they have to say, and begin the conversation with a desire and eagerness to restore your relationship.


St. Joseph's No Nut Policy

In the diagram, PQ = PR = QS and $\angle QPR = 20^{\circ}$. What is $\angle RQS$?






The answer is B, 60°

Sixth Form - Beginning and End of the School Day

I would like to take the opportunity to welcome our Year 12 students into the Sixth Form, they have had a very positive first day!

Further to the school opening plan and in order to comply with good practice around social distancing, students in Year 12 and 13 will not have to arrive to school until their first lesson of the day. If they have a lesson period 1, then they must be in school on time for registration.

If students have a gap between lessons they are welcome to use the study room in school. Students must go home when their lessons finish.

The exceptions to this are if students are taking part in a sanctioned school activity or if there is a specific need that must be met and we can cater for this on a case by case basis. Please contact Mr Clark and we can arrange this for you g.clark@st-josephs.slough.sch.uk.

Students must attend all of their timetabled Private Study lessons and we expect all students to be on time to school and wash their hands on entry.

Structure of the day:

Sixth form will have break (10.55-11.15am) and lunch (1.20-1.55pm) at the normal times and will use the quad **only** at these times if they wish to be outside.

iPad payments - these are payable on ParentPay only and not via cash or cheque at the office.

Pupil Premium

All students who receive Free School Meals, are looked after or have parents in the Armed Forces are eligible to apply for the Pupil Premium. This is extra funding to support them perform well in their education. Please let us know if your family circumstances have changed over lockdown and we can send an application form to check eligibility.

All students are welcome to join us for Breakfast every morning from 7.30am. This is free of charge and means that all students are fed and ready to start the day.

Year 11 English News

Dear Parents and Guardians

I wanted to write to you all to explain a couple of developments within English/Literature affecting all students entering into Year 11 this term.

I am sure you will have heard lots of talk in the press over the last 4 weeks about how there are some changes for the Summer 2021 Literature exam. At the time of writing and based on the most recent information available, Ofqual have not yet confirmed the precise content requirements of the AQA Literature exam but I have been informed by the exam board that an announcement should be following very soon.

What I can confirm is that we will continue to study and prepare the Literature texts *Macbeth, An Inspector Calls* and *Jekyll and Hyde* alongside the wider English curriculum. Regarding poetry, Ofqual (and our board AQA) are yet to finalise the plan for the poetry element but we will be informing students as soon as we receive confirmation.

Additionally, and separately from any Governmental decision, we are very fortunate to be able to expand the number of teaching sets from 6 to 8 going into Year 11. This allows for smaller class sizes and even more focused teacher:pupil interaction and support with a view to maximising all students' chances of success. Inevitably this has meant a review of the setting therefore in several cases there will be movement into a different set. This sometimes raises questions and I would like to reassure all parents and students that these decisions are always made with the students' best interests at heart.

Significantly, I would also like to clarify that both English and Literature are 'single tier' subjects – the content and grading structure is the same for **all** students and no one is limited to the grade they can achieve. Furthermore, the content and skills practised are also common across **all classes**. The only difference therefore is in the style of delivery but as our recent track record shows, this has only strengthened the quality of the students' outcomes.

Finally, my English department colleagues and I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you for how you supported, in whatever capacity eg. in preparing, engaging with, recording etc. the Speaking and Listening activity under lockdown conditions back in the Summer Term. Your efforts have lightened the workload of our wonderful Year 11s before entering what I am sure will be both an exciting but challenging year ahead.
