Learning at St Joseph's

"Building learning that lasts"

We are a learning community. Learning occurs through exceptional teaching with trust, understanding and moral purpose at its core. Our mission is to create curious, resilient, determined lifelong learners who don't view the world as it is but as it should be. We aim to develop learners who are prepared for life in a world characterised by change, who can thrive as part of a school community which extends beyond the school gate. 'Only the best is good enough' has become a mantra for aspiration, Students at St Joseph's work towards highly ambitious targets from Year 7 through to the Sixth Form.

Our insistence of high academic rigour has resulted in the students making outstanding <u>progress</u> during their time with us placing the school in the top 5% of schools nationally for progress (top 10% Fischer Family Trust 2018 & 2019) and in the top 6 best performing and improving schools in the country in April 2016 (HMI Inspection). The Curriculum at St Joseph's

Our curriculum's intention is to allow all learners, irrespective of their starting point, the means to unlock their belief to be the best possible version of themselves. Aiming to provide the Attributes, Skills and Knowledge for our students to change society for the better. Our curriculum pathways, established thorough analysis of prior attainment and currently working at grades, enable all pupils to make exceptional progress.

Over 50 extra curricular activities are embedded in the daily timetable alongside a strong reading programme which allows students to read at least 30 extra challenging novels outside of their lessons by the time they finish at the school.

Year 7 students will experience a three year, knowledge rich, Key Stage 3 which provides access to the best of what has been thought and said in history. Our two year Key Stage 4 deepens students' understanding and aims to connect the world's big ideas. An Information and Guidance process helps students begin their GCSE courses in Year 10. Pathways are carefully developed to give students opportunities to select courses relevant to their future ambitions, areas of interest and expertise. The number of students taking EBACC qualifications is considerably higher than the national average and we are one of the only schools in Slough to offer the challenging 'Triple Science' GCSE to our most able cohorts. We've shown that students at St Joseph's study a curriculum that unlocks entry to the best Universities in the world.

The vast majority of our students remain with us to study A' Levels at sixth form. Over the past 9 years, 100% of our students have secured a destination of their choice, whether it be a place at their preferred university or in the workplace.

Life as a Sixth Form student at St Joseph's is stimulating, inspiring and enjoyable. The Sixth Form numbers over 200 students. Our students leave with excellent qualifications and experiences which will serve them throughout their lives. For example, our students have gone on to study Medicine at Cambridge University, Kings College University of London and Plymouth University; Law at Bristol University and a variety of subjects at a wide range of Russell Group universities.

At Sixth Form we bridge the gap to adulthood. Students develop across many areas of school life, contributing intentionally to the school climate. The prefect system allows students to grow as leaders and to engage in many initiatives to broaden their horizons, be it participation in our partnership programme with Eton College or funding missionary work in Thailand. Students are challenged to engage in enrichment activities that resonate with our core values as a Catholic school.

We aim to provide each and every student in our care with the best experience possible. Students who choose to be part of our Sixth Form are expected to have high ambitions and expectations of themselves.
