Weekly Reflections
7th December 2025
2nd Sunday of Advent



Theme of the Week – Peace

The Gospel reading on Sunday might seem a little at odds with the theme of the week, 'Peace'. Within this Gospel, we hear of John the Baptist saying to the Pharisees and Sadducees as they come to him, "**You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?**" Maybe not the most peaceful manner to address someone! However, the theme of Peace is not focused on what John has to say, more the opportunity John is providing for those who come to him.

In the world 2000 year ago and in our world today, we see and hear violence, selfishness and greed. So many of us have desires for material goods and wealth that this leads us away from what is truly right. John speaks from the desert, and if stranded in the desert, what would you take to survive? Most likely only the essential items, precious items we hold dearly. In the desert we are called to conversion, to change one's mind. Why? John tells us: **Because the kingdom of heaven is at hand**, and unless we change the way we think, we won't be able to welcome it and be part of it.

In Advent we prepare for the coming of this kingdom by examining ourselves, our life and our projects. John warns that every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down. **PEACE** is one of these fruits, but what is peace? It is not simply the absence of war, and something that can be imposed on peoples and nations. **True peace is the inner state of those who have accepted the new kingdom and its king, Jesus, the Prince of Peace.** Only those who are transformed by the proposal of Jesus can reach true peace, and only those who have peace within themselves can be promoters of peace in our school, in our families, in our nation and in the world. This week how can you be **Eloquent** and **Truthful** in promoting peace to all those around you?

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 3: 1-12

In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.' For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said, 'The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight."'

Now John wore a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan were going out to him, and they were baptised by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our father", for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham. Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

'I baptise you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

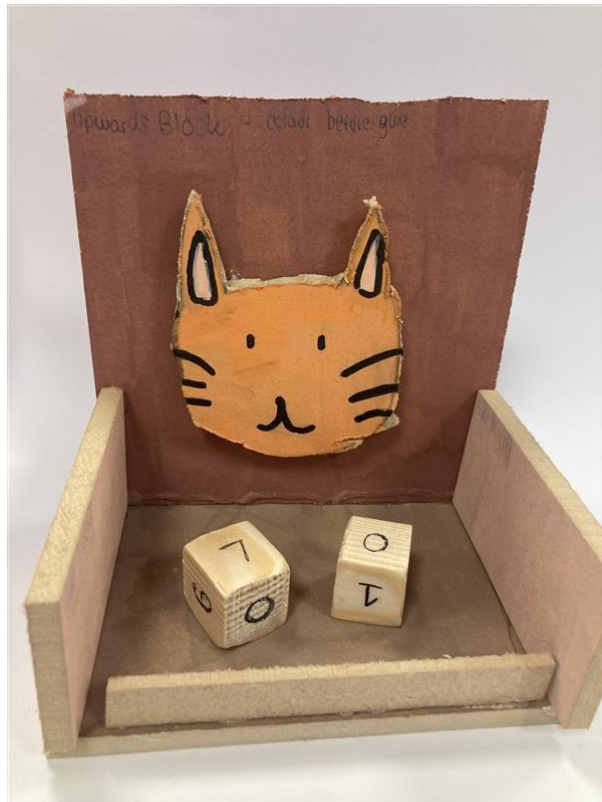

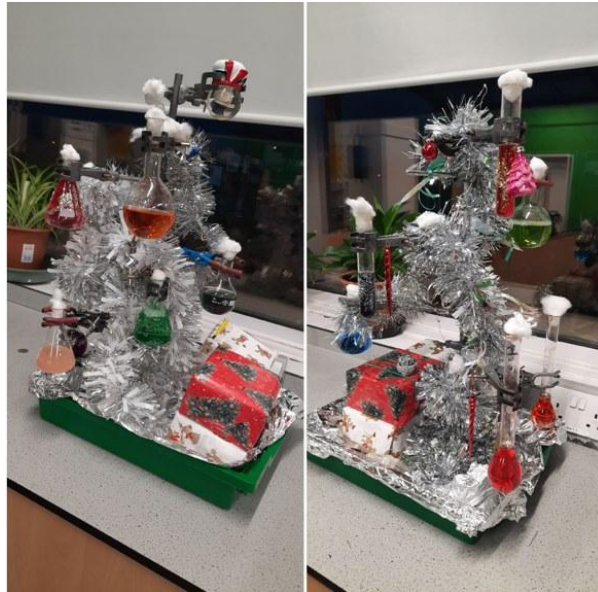

I Can do Maths

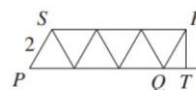
Solution to last Week's Puzzler

- A** In the diagram shown, T is the foot of the perpendicular from R to PQ produced. Consider triangle QTR . Angle $QTR = 90^\circ$ and, because the sum of angles on a straight line = 180° , angle $RQT = (180 - 2 \times 60)^\circ = 60^\circ$. So $\sin 60^\circ = \frac{RT}{QR}$ and hence

$$RT = QR \times \sin 60^\circ = 2 \times \frac{\sqrt{3}}{2} = \sqrt{3}. \text{ Also } \cos 60^\circ = \frac{QT}{QR}, \text{ so}$$

$$QT = QR \times \cos 60^\circ = 2 \times \frac{1}{2} = 1. \text{ Therefore } PT = 7.$$

$$\text{By Pythagoras' Theorem, } PR^2 = PT^2 + TR^2 = 7^2 + (\sqrt{3})^2 \\ = 49 + 3 = 52. \text{ So } PR = \sqrt{52} = \sqrt{4 \times 13} = 2\sqrt{13}.$$



Solution to the Break-time Teaser:

- D** It may be shown that $0.\dot{1} = \frac{1}{9}$. So $0.\dot{8} = \frac{8}{9}$ and $0.0\dot{7} = \frac{7}{90}$.

$$\text{Therefore } 0.\dot{8} + 0.0\dot{7} = \frac{8}{9} + \frac{7}{90} = \frac{80}{90} + \frac{7}{90} = \frac{87}{90} = \frac{29}{30}. \text{ Now } \frac{29}{30} = 9 + \frac{2}{3} = 9 + 0.\dot{6} = 9.\dot{6}.$$

$$\text{So } \frac{29}{30} = 0.9\dot{6}. \text{ Hence } 0.\dot{8} + 0.0\dot{7} = 0.9\dot{6}.$$

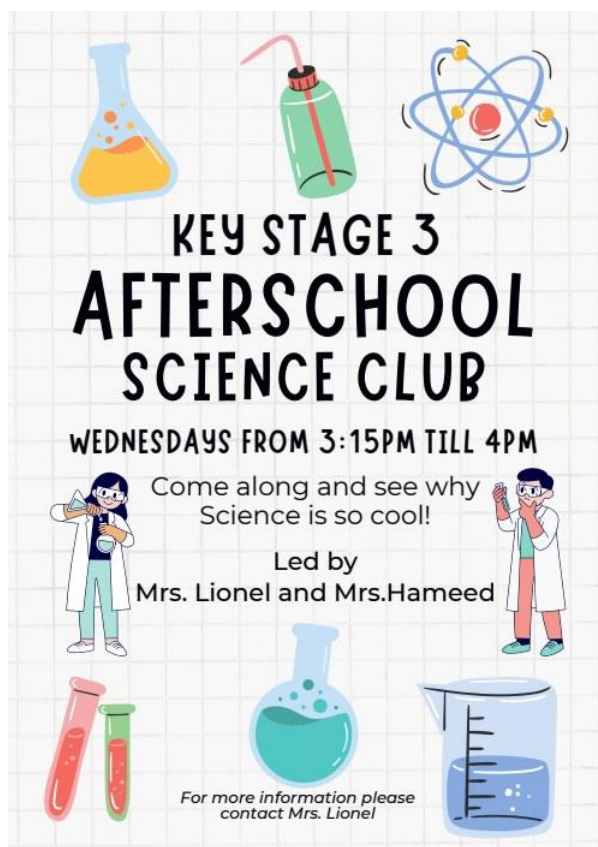

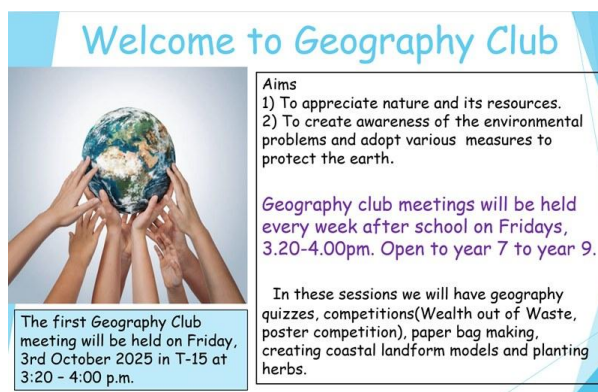
