THEME OF THE WEEK - Being Sent

Our theme this week is 'Being Sent'. Jesus in the Gospel sends out the 72 in pairs to witness and proclaim the Good News of Jesus. We too have been sent out by Jesus to witness and to proclaim the Good News. He gives the 72 some instruction to go without anything, and to greet everyone with peace. He also gives instruction to walk away when they are not welcomed. It can be challenging at times when we are witnessing to our faith and proclaiming the Good News of Jesus.

Are we ready to go out on mission to witness and proclaim to others of the Good News of Jesus? In what ways can we witness to our faith?

Within Jesus' instruction to the 72, we get a sense for the need to be humble in our work that He has called us and sent us out to do. We go on gently and humbly with our work, giving all praise in thanksgiving back to God. If we are not welcomed, then we simply walk on. We do the best that we can, and God will do the rest. It is He who gives us the strength and the words in which to say. We need only to ask Him to help us and to fill us with His Spirit.

We read too in the Gospel Jesus saying; "rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20) – Jesus says this at the end of the Gospel reading, to celebrate the love of God – He who knows you by name. We must rejoice by giving the glory to God. In all things, God gives us great gifts.

What does it mean to you to know that your name is written in heaven?

In what ways can you give the glory back to God?

The theme from last week of 'Discernment' links very well with this week's theme of 'Being Sent'. We must discern where Jesus is calling us and to where He is sending us. How do we discern where Jesus is calling and sending us? It is through prayer and listening. In our everyday actions, we discern and reflect on what we are good at, on what we like or do not like, our interests, our hobbies etc. It is in these moments too that we are discerning. But we must keep the Lord in our discerning, to ask Him of what He wants of us, and for us to share with Him our thoughts, reflections and decisions.

Being Sent

Weekly Reflections 4th July 2022





A reading from St Luke's Gospel Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. 'Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. 'Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.' The seventy-two came back rejoicing, 'Lord,' they said 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven."

You will be able to claim free school meals for your child if you receive one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have a net income from employment of no more than £7400 per year). For more information on how the government calculates your earnings from employment whilst claiming Universal Credit, please check the "Eligibility under Universal Credit" section below.
- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit





Solution to last Week's Puzzler

Let square PQRS have side 3x cm. Then, as PT : TQ = 1 : 2, PT = x cm. Similarly, US = x cm. In triangles PTS and UST, PT = US, $\angle PTS = \angle UST$ (alternate angles) and TS is common to both. So the triangles are congruent (SAS). Therefore UT = PS = 3x cm and $\angle TUS = \angle SPT = 90^{\circ}$. Hence PTUS is a rectangle, which has perimeter 40 cm. So



40 = 2(3x + x) = 8x. Therefore x = 5 and the area of PTUS, in cm², is $15 \times 5 = 75$.

Solution to the Break time Teaser:

$$\mathbf{D} \quad \frac{2}{5} + \frac{2}{50} + \frac{2}{500} = \frac{200 + 20 + 2}{500} = \frac{222}{500} = \frac{444}{1000} = 0.444.$$
