What do you think the Kingdom of God is like?


St Paul says it's 'righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit'. Would you agree? Would you add any other words to this list?

School Vaccinations - Nasal Flu Vaccine and COVID-19 vaccination

The school-aged immunisation team will be visiting St Josephs on **Monday 1**st **November 2021** to offer nasal flu to students in years 7-11 and a single dose of the Pfizer/ BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine to students in years 8-11.

We plan to co-administer these vaccines within the same session (if consent is obtained for both).

To prepare for the delivery of one or both of the above programmes parents must give consent. A separate consent form must be completed for each jab.

Copies of these forms can be found as attachments to this newsletter.

Due to the recent announcement of the COVID-19 programme to students in years 12-15 we are still awaiting a number of guidance documents before we can start administering the COVID-19 vaccine. If this guidance is not received in advance of your planned session date we will not be able to safely co-administer both COVID-19 and flu, therefore we would just administer nasal flu to all eligible students in years 7-11. TVLP Student Leadership Conference

On Wednesday, our head boy and girl, and deputy head boy and girl attended a student leadership conference run by Future Foundations, hosted at Slough and Eton school. It was a fantastic day working on developing leadership skills. Aidan Lambourne, our Deputy Headboy, has written the following account of the day:

Our trip to Slough and Eton to take part in TVLP's workshop was highly enjoyable. Aside from building spaghetti bridges (mine and Emma's could hold a tangerine, by the way) and getting to know what inspires each other, we worked on leadership and teamwork, two values that are becoming increasingly important.

In a Dragon's Den style pitching session, we all had to employ our leadership and teamwork to deliver pitches on social attitudes that we deemed needed changing. From charities, to mental health, to the environment and even bullying, the workshop was a very reassuring sign that our local young communities have their heads where it counts.



Student Leadership Positions

Next week, students will receive information about the student leadership positions available in the school. This year, the student leadership team will have 2 strands:

- Subject student leaders
- Year group student leaders

Subject student leaders

As a subject student leader, you will work closely with a department in the school of your choosing to:

- understand the rationale behind the curriculum for that subject
- feedback to the head of department students' views in your year group
- be an ambassador for that subject

Year group student leaders:

• As a year group student leader, students will find out what the key views are of their year group, present these at leadership team meetings and work to find solutions/improvements that we can act on.

Being a student leader will help:

- Develop team working skills
- Gain confidence
- Improve your oracy skills through speaking in meetings/to your form group/year group
- Gain a sense of achievement when you work to improve/change something
- Work towards a number of the St Joseph's pupil profile attributes
- Be an excellent addition to your CV for future jobs or apprenticeships and UCAS application (university application)

How to apply:

Students will receive an email (to their school email address) with a link to a Microsoft Forms page to register interest and explain why they want to be part of the student leadership team

The form will ask:

- 1. Whether you are applying for subject or year group student leader
- 2. What year are you in
- 3. Which subject you would like to work with (if applicable)
- 4. Why you want to be part of the student leadership team

Absence

If your son/daughter is absent for any reason please ring the school as soon as possible on the first morning of their absence. Please also send an explanatory note to the form tutor on his/her return. In certain circumstances we may need to obtain copies of medical notes from doctors to confirm the reasons for absence.

If you know in advance about a medical appointment, it would help if you send a note before the absence letting the form tutor know when the pupil should leave the school, and when he/she is likely to return so that we can get the anticipated work missed to you in advance


Lost Property

Solution to last Week's Puzzler

. D When the net is folded up to form the rhombicuboctahedron, the left-hand edge of the square marked X is joined to the right-hand edge of the square marked E so that the eight squares at the centre of the net form a band





around the solid. In this band, the square opposite square P is the square which is four squares away from P, that is square D. So if the square marked P is placed face down on a table, then the square marked D will be facing up.

The circle has radius 1 cm. Two vertices of the square lie on the circle. One edge of the square goes through the centre of the circle, as shown.


