From The Head Teacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been wonderful to welcome the new recruits to St Joseph's this week who look a fantastic collection of young people. There's been a lot happening behind the scenes to ensure we're ready to go and so I've included some of the future arrangements. Please not the parent Welcome Evenings are from 5pm-6pm (see dates below) – an earlier time than what was advertised in July.

 \cdot Monday 6th September transition day 2 for Year 7 and induction day for Year 12 only (LAT Flow testing for Years 8 9am, 9 11am and year 10 1pm). Years 8, 9 & 10 come in for testing only -then go home.

3rd September 2021

- · Tuesday 7th September year 7 in school for lessons (LAT flow testing for years 11 9am, Year 12 11am, Year 13 1pm). Year 11, 12 and 13 come in for testing only then go straight home.
- · Wednesday 8th September Year 7, 12 and 13 in school all day. (LAT flow testing year 7)
- · Thursday 9th September whole school returns. Years 7& 8 go to the lower school playground, Years 10&11 go to the Upper school playground and year 9 go to the Quad area. Sixth Form go to their communal study room. Students will receive their timetables in tutor time and Period 1 (PSHE).

The students should be in school uniform for the testing. This will be important, as there will be occasions over the testing period when other students will be in lessons over the staggered beginning of the year. The students will be given a test-at-home-kit which for the next 2 weeks after their first test at school.

This may be a good opportunity to remind the students about our expectations of uniform so there isn't any unnecessary upset when the students return – we're pretty conservative in our approach to uniform so if in doubt, please contact the school for clarification in advance. On the days that students have PE, they should now come to school in school uniform where they can change in the changing rooms.

Boys

- · Trousers Grey/Black
- · Socks Dark Grey/Black
- · Shoes Hard sensible Black (no trainers/boots)

Girls

- · Skirt Thomson Tartan no shorter than knee length
- · Socks White or Black ankle length NOT knee length
- · Shoes Hard sensible Black (no canvas plimsoles, trainers, boots)

Other uniform matters include:

- · No make-up should be worn. Girls may wear one small plain (gold/silver) stud earring (no stones) in the lower lobe of each ear.
- · Boys may wear one small plain (gold/silver) stud earring (no stones) in one ear only.
- · No other piercings such as tongue studs, navel, lip, nose or eye-brow piercings are allowed.
- · No bracelets to be worn and necklaces should not be visible.
- · One plain flat ring may be worn.
- · Boys hairstyles must be short, neat and tidy no extremes (tram lines or patterns); shaved eyebrows are not permitted.
- · No extreme colours in the hair no dyed hairstyles or colours.
- · No tattoos.
- · No Hoodies (other than school issued Hoodies for specific St Joseph's teams that are school logo'd)
- · No clothing (other than regulation school uniform is to be worn) with slogans, badges or other insignia on them.
- · A dark plain coat for school (black, dark grey or dark navy) with only plain scarves (again black, grey or navy)
- · No coloured/painted nails or artificial nails (the latter of which are a safety hazard).

The school day starts with registration at 8.30am sharp. Students should ensure they are on site well before then. The school day finishes for all students at 3pm. The school day will retain a staggered break time and lunchtime. Now that year groups do not need to socially bubble we're able to use the canteen for several year groups which will help with the distribution of hot food as well as the second outlet in the Quad area.

We'll be taking the opportunity to meet face to face with you as parents and carers and share important information with you about your child's academic year is shaped with a Welcome Evening for each group early in the start of the Academic Year 5pm – 6pm. These are important evenings to us and we feel it important for you to be here.

- · Year 9 Welcome and Introduction Evening 29th September

- · Year 13 Post 18 Options Evening (Universities, UCAS and training)

Finally, it's really exciting to be coming back to the school when things look as though they are returning to normal. That may change as the year goes on but we'll keep you updated with any changes that impact on the school day as soon as they are made available to us. To that end, I've also attached the most up to date plan of how we'll deal with the current pressures of maintaining the education of the children within a Covid context in the document Continuing Education: Practical Arrangements which is also on the school website. This document outlines all possible scenarios and how the plan to continue learning and teaching in whatever situation presents itself.

Theme of the Week
