Year 11 Students completed their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Expedition

From The Head Teacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for the support you've shown all of us here when we've asked the students to return to wearing masks. Whilst the general advice and guidance is to carry on regardless, this week was a stern reminder that the virus is still active in the larger community. Due to an external event, a number of students tested positive this week and we reassessed our risk assessment in line with all the relevant Health authorities. The current variant of CV19 moves quickly and expediently. At the beginning of this week we were far from meeting any threshold to review our practices and then within 24 hours we'd crossed it.

Apart from the obvious inconveniences and uncomfortableness of wearing a mask, the students have been great in taking on board the necessity and need to 'mask up'. It's obviously not a situation we'd wish to be in but we'll always put safety first – even as a precaution. Further to the letter I sent out earlier in the week we're in daily contact with the Health Security Agency (who from this morning have overtaken *Public Health England*). The main points to underline to everyone in our school community are:

- 1. Please do continue twice-weekly LAT Flow tests. Our next order is due to arrive next week so we'll be able to provide enough tests for over the half term. They will be distributed next week when they have arrived.
- 2. The weekend and the forthcoming 2 week half term should act as a natural firebreak to the current number of cases we're experiencing in all year groups.
- 3. If you have symptoms; please don't come to school until you've taken a PCR test and received the results—but if you have symptoms and are absent please let us know about together with the LAT flow test results. It's critical for the next stages of our planning. The Delta Variant has other symptoms which can be found on the NHS on line government website which you can find at https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/main-symptoms/; these include unusual headaches, diarrhea and vomiting. You can request PCRs via the on-line NHS portal. In short if you are not well get a PCR test organized.
- 4. One year group who have not been impacted adversely is the Sixth Form the vast majority of which have informed us, have already had the vaccine. If there is a large uptake of the vaccine, its more likely we'll be able to return to normal, restriction free. We'll monitor for the first week after 1st November vaccinations and assess at that point. After a week from the vaccinations we'll be a stronger place to assess whether restrictions will need to continue.
- 5. <u>Academic Review Day</u>: Instead of face-to-face meetings; we'll move this <u>on-line</u> on October 15th. The appointments will stay the same time and the tutors will contact you through your son or daughter's Teams account. The reports will be issued to the students by Wednesday in hard copy to take home. The Form Tutor will be able to access the reports electronically and on *Teams* your child will be able to write up their targets after discussing their report wit you and the Form Tutor.
- 6. Unfortunately, we've had to suspend the <u>Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme</u> overnight camp. I know the students were bitterly disappointed about this we've not wanted to take this decision but upon advice from Public Health England it really does seem the better option. Likewise, upon advice we have had to suspend all fixtures with Year 10 teams until further notice.
- 7. <u>Vaccinations 1st November</u>: Berkshire NHS have organised their one visit for COVID-19 administration. Due to the sheer enormity of the programme they have had to shut down the electronic consent form system an additional 48 hours prior to any planned session date to allow the clinical team to safely administer. <u>Parent's and Carer's deadline to provide consent is NOW by 12pm Wednesday 27th October. Please be aware that the school immunisation team are currently <u>unable to book any</u> catch up clinics for COVID-19. We've bookings in advance for educational trips next year (for example the Battlefields trip), currently *travel companies are not insuring students* who will not have been or who are vaccinated. That means they will not be able to go on these trips.</u>
- 8. The situation in school is reflective of the local covid situation in Slough.
- 9. Consequent to the above, we've pushed back the PPE1 (mocks1) back to start on the 15th November.

Unless there is need to place a letter out as a matter of urgency, we'll continue to keep you updated each week through the Newsletter to try to ensure that the information shared is in one place and distilled to the most important details only.

Have a restful week and as, ever, thank you for the tremendous support this week.

Theme of the Week

KINGDOM OF GOD

Our Gospel reading this week continues to come from St Mark. Jesus uses images and examples to help teach His followers about the Kingdom of God and eternal life. We hear of a young man who wants to enter eternal life, but he doesn't want to give up his possessions or to start a new direction in his life of following Jesus. This story gets us to think about our possessions and to reflect on our relationship with material things, but also challenges us to think about the direction that our lives are going in and whether we need to discern whether we may need to change our direction slightly. Sometimes our things that we own can distract us from what is important. To be a follower of Jesus, we need to take a step back and re-focus our hearts and minds on what is important in our lives. This may mean actually giving up some of our possessions, giving them to others who may need them such as some of our clothes or shoes etc. We may also need to think about the direction that our lives are going in too.

What is important to you? E.G. Family, friends, prayer...

Are you making good decisions, do you need to think about your actions?

What do you need to do to be a follower of Jesus?

In what ways can you build the Kingdom of God here on earth?

Jesus talks about 'treasure in heaven' within this weeks' Gospel. When we think of 'treasure', we think of things we have found. We can find God through prayer, through others and through our experiences.

Where have you experienced God in your life?

We are encouraged too, by Jesus when He says; "everything is possible for God" – When Jesus says this, He is reminding us to put our trust in God. When we put our trust in God, we can know that He is carrying us, He wants what's best for us. Spend a moment today, saying quietly in your heart; 'I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me' (Philippians 4:13).

Important Information

Nasal Flu Vaccine and COVID-19 vaccination

School-aged Immunisation Team





Dear Parent and Carers,

The school-aged immunisation team will be visiting St Joseph's Catholic High School on Monday 1st November 2021 to offer nasal flu to students in years 7-11 and a single dose of the Pfizer/BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine to students in years 8-11. We plan to co-administer these vaccines within the same session (if consent is obtained for both).

Due to the sheer enormity of the programme we have had to shut down the electronic consent form system an <u>additional</u> 48 hours prior to any planned session date to allow the clinical team to safely administer. <u>Deadline for consent forms is 12pm by Wednesday 27th October 2021.</u>

Please be aware that you MUST complete a separate consent form for each different vaccination programme e.g. FLU, COVID-19. This is because they are two separate vaccinations that require a different set of clinical questions to be asked before vaccination can occur. If we only receive a completed consent form for one vaccination programme we are unable to take consent on the day or in the 48 hours prior to the school session, as we have to safely check and triage all forms. Please return to the e-consent system, using the details sent out in your initial consent letter (emailed from your child's school) if you need to complete any further consent forms.

Please be aware that the school immunisation team are currently <u>unable to book any</u> catch up clinics for COVID-19. Due to the large cohort size of eligible 12-15 year olds there is currently national discussion around how students who were absent, unwell, or unable to have their COVID-19 vaccination in school will be caught up outside of a school setting. As soon as we have confirmation of how catch up clinics will be offered we will send further communication out to all parents.

Please note that it is not currently possible to attend a mass vaccination site to access a COVID-19 vaccine for young people aged 12-15 and you will be turned away. This is because there needs to be a particular workforce for this age group that need to have additional training requirements than what is currently required to vaccinate young people aged 16+.



Reports and Academic Review Day

I would just like to confirm that that the Academic Review Day this coming **Friday 15**th **October** will still be going ahead. **The only change to the day is the fact that all meetings will take place <u>online</u>, rather than in the school**. Like last year's Parents' Evening we will be using Microsoft Teams as our online platform. We will be using your son/daughters school 'Teams' account for the video call; your child should be able to guide you through the technical aspect of this! For new pupils, we will provide training to them beforehand so that you are all set for Friday.

In order to help facilitate our Academic Review Day on Teams; on Wednesday students will be given their reports in an envelope to take home. For any students not in, we will send these out in the post to parents.

Academic Review Day is an excellent opportunity to discuss with your child's form tutor how your child has started the term both academically and pastorally. During the meeting we ask that parents, students and tutors set targets in the following areas:

- Two Academic Targets
- One Personal Development Target
- Two Extra-Curricular Targets
- For Year 11 and 13 only, a careers destination (what do they hope to do next year)

With the academic, personal development and extra-curricular targets – these options will also be sent out with students' reports, so parents have this to hand at home. We also ask that parents sit with their child and set three targets for themselves on their report as they would normally do in school. Your child's report will also include their reading age, and an additional handout will be sent out with the reports for parents, to explain how this has been obtained








Drama News



Solution to last Week's Puzzler

A Let the length of the side of the square be 2x cm. Then, using Pythagoras' Theorem in the triangle shown, $(2x)^2 + x^2 = 1^2$. So $4x^2 + x^2 = 1$. Therefore $x^2 = \frac{1}{5}$ and the area of the square is $4x^2$ cm² = $\frac{4}{5}$ cm².



Solution to the Break time Teaser:


