Rowing Festival

Theme of the Week – The Advocate

We continue to read from the so-called Farewell Discourse of Jesus, which occupies chapters 14 to 17 of the Gospel of John, and in which Jesus, after supper, prepares them for mission in prevision of his Ascension to the father. In these chapters the word LOVE appears 26 times, but in the text we read this week it is referred to Jesus himself for the first time: If you love me, you will keep my commandments. The Greek language has four words for love: *Philia*, as in Francophile, is the love between people who like each other's company. *Eros* is the love of lovers. *Storge* is the protective love of parents, and *Agape* is a love that is **self-forgetting and self-giving**, a **SACRIFICIAL LOVE**. *Guess* which one Jesus is talking about? That's right, **AGAPE**.

What are these commandments Jesus wants us to keep? The 10 commandments of Moses? During the Last Supper Jesus rose from the table, put on an apron and washed his disciples' feet. Then he told them: I give you a **new commandment**, that you love one another as I have loved you! The word NEW in the original Greek (kalvity) doesn't mean something which is added to something, but rather something which gives new meaning and replaces something old. Jesus gives the commandment of LOVING ONE ANOTHER as the fulfilment of all previous commandments. Does that mean that the 10 commandments are abrogated? NO, but it means that the real purpose of these is LOVE OF GOD AND ONE ANOTHER. Why did God give us commandments? Because he wants us to be happy and live to the fullest our humanity. In our society we often consider commandments something that deprives us of freedom, and we do this because we have a wrong understanding of freedom. True freedom is not doing what we want. Suppose you buy a car, the manufacturer will tell you that the tank should be filled with diesel, but you want to exercise your freedom and fill it with milk instead. What would happen? The car will break, and you won't get where you wanted to go. Or suppose you want to learn Spanish; you have to submit to the rules of the language if you want to be free to speak that language! In the same way God gave us commandments as an instruction manual in order to make sure that we live lives which are contented, meaningful, purposeful and fully realised. For Catholics, these commandment are those found in Scripture, and the moral/doctrinal teaching of the Church under the headship of the Pope. There are many people around today who say that they believe in and love Jesus, but then live lives in contradiction with his mandates, in greed, immorality, selfishness, lack of forgiveness etc. - that simply fails the test of the Gospel! On Thursday we will celebrate the Ascension of Jesus, when he returned to the Father. We could say that Jesus left the physical presence of his disciples, so that he may be spiritually present with all people of the world. The disciples were rather discouraged at the thought that He would leave them, but he reassured them saying that he would send another ADVOCATE.

An advocate (Latin *ad* = by, *vocatus* = called) is literally one who is 'called by' us, a defender, one who assists and speaks for people against an enemy or opponent (In many Latin languages this is the actual word for 'barrister', IT *Avvocato*, ES *Abogado*, FR, *Avocat* etc.). Jesus sends **ANOTHER DEFENDER** (He was the first one), but to defend us from what? Who are the enemies of humanity? The WORLD, the **FLESH**, and the **DEVIL**. The **WORLD** is the mentality of the masses, that temptation to do things just because everybody else is doing it, to be popular and to fear the judgment of others. The **FLESH** is every temptation that we have to make a god of our own bodies and the pleasures that we get from them (food, drink, sex, drugs etc.). The **DEVIL** is that personal spiritual being who is always trying to take us away from God and bring us towards self-destruction and destruction of one another because he simply hates everything that God loves.

The Holy Spirit, therefore, is sent to fortify us, give us the strength to be faithful to the mandates of Jesus, reassure us of his presence with us, and prepare us for battle against all the forces of evil that dehumanize us.

We pray particularly for those in our school who will receive the seal of the Holy Spirit during Confirmation in the coming weeks.

THE ADVOCATE

From the Gospel according to John (14:15-21)

Jesus said to his disciples:

'If you love me you will keep my commandments.

I shall ask the Father,

and he will give you another Advocate

to be with you for ever,

that Spirit of truth

whom the world can never receive

since it neither sees nor knows him;

but you know him,

because he is with you, he is in you.

I will not leave you orphans;

I will come back to you.

In a short time the world will no longer see me; but you will see me,

because I live and you will live.

On that day you will understand that I am in my Father

and you in me and I in you.

Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me;

and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father,

and I shall love him and show myself to him.'

At St Joseph's we are aware and understand that the current cost of living crisis causes worry and concern for many. 





