Prayer for the Week




YEAR 12 NEWS

Semana Santa is a week-long celebration that takes place in cities all over Spain. During the festival, thousands of people take part in processions. Floats carry religious statues representing religious scenes. Marching bands play religious music with crowds lining the streets to witness it all.

Of all Spain's many and varied festivals, **Semana Santa** is the most sombre but also one of the most captivating. The festival pays homage to Jesus Christ's last days before he was crucified. Many floats (called **pasos** or **tronos**) feature an effigy of him either carrying a crucifix or already on it. The Virgin Mary is also a prominent effigy.

Our students have created outstanding projects about this celebration. Here are some of them:



Solution to last Week's Puzzler

C The perimeter of each rectangle is 2 × (3 + 1) cm = 8 cm.
The total perimeter, in cm, of the separate rectangles is therefore 100 × 8 = 800. When two rectangles are placed together at a "join" in the pattern, there is an overlap of length 1 cm and the total perimeter is reduced by 2 cm. In the complete pattern there are 99 joins and hence its perimeter, in cm, is 800 - 99 × 2 = 800 - 198 = 602.
