


★ Year 10 Boys Football Team - Won their league! ★

Free school meals

Am I eligible for free school meals?

You will be able to claim free school meals for your child if you receive one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have a net income from employment of no more than £7400 per year). For more information on how the government calculates your earnings from employment whilst claiming Universal Credit, please check the "Eligibility under Universal Credit" section below.
- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Results Days

Below is information regarding our results day and sixth form enrolment. We greatly look forward to celebrating the successes of all of our students. Please refer to the letters sent by Mr Stack-Clark and Mr Cudmore regarding more detail around results days and enrolment, however below are the key points to note:

Year 12 & 13 Results Day – 18th of August

Our first results day this summer will be the Year 12 and 13 students collecting their Level 3 results (A Level, AS Level, L3 BTEC and Core Maths). Students will come in and collect results from **9am.** It is likely they will know their university outcome before this. If a student does not get their first or insurance choice, they will need to go through clearing, which you can find here: https://www.ucas.com/node/5456

Students will collect their results from an allocated member of staff in the main hall (by form) and there will be an opportunity for students to gather in the quad and enjoy an ice cream with staff before they move off to pastures new.

For those students who did not make their first or insurance university choices and require some guidance in school, E4 will be available for students to access their UCAS Clearing account. Whilst this is largely done online now (in the past it used to be the case that students would phone around), staff will still be on hand to advise.

Year 11 Results Day and Sixth Form Enrolment - 25th of August

Our Year 11 results day and sixth form enrolment will take place on the 25th of August. Students will have **an allocated time slot** to collect their results. Slots starting at **9am** and in tutor group pairings, which are:

9:00 - 9:30 C and J

9:30 - 10:00 M and P

10:00 - 10:30 T and V

Students will collect their results from an allocated member of staff in the main hall and there will be an opportunity for students to gather in the quad and enjoy an ice cream together.

Enrolment – whilst all students who have applied to St Joseph's have received a more detailed letter on enrolment guidance, the key point is that students will sign up for sixth form courses at the moment of collecting their results.

Students will then collect:

- The Sixth Form handbook
- iPad form & use policy
- Bursary application form
- Start of term letter (this will explain the first day of Year 12).

N.B. Year 12/13 students who do Re Take will collect their results on this day too.

I will not be continuing as their Head of Year, as I am moving on to pastures new, but I am so glad that my final year at St Joseph's has been spent working with Year 7 and


their families. I can honestly



Reading ideas for families During the Summer Break

- Read together: Look for time to read together and talk about the books you read.
- **Tell stories**: Use some of your holiday time together to tell stories from your childhood.
- **Give books**: Give your child a book for the holidays. It does not have to be new.
- Visit the library: Encourage your child to read for pleasure
- Make travel fun: if you are traveling during your holidays, look for maps and tourist books about your destination.







Solution to last Week's Puzzler

A Let the small sides of each triangle have length r. This is also the side of the original square. The longer side of each triangle is $\sqrt{2}r$, since that is the diagonal of the square.

Hence the perimeters of shapes P, Q, R are $(2 + 3\sqrt{2})r$, $(6 + \sqrt{2})r$ and $(4 + 3\sqrt{2})r$ respectively.

Now $6 + \sqrt{2} - (2 + 3\sqrt{2}) = 4 - 2\sqrt{2} = 2(2 - \sqrt{2})$, which is greater than zero.

Therefore the perimeter of P is less than the perimeter of Q.

Also, $4 + 3\sqrt{2} - (6 + \sqrt{2}) = 2\sqrt{2} - 2 = 2(\sqrt{2} - 1)$, which is also greater than 0.

Therefore the perimeter of Q is less than the perimeter of R.

Hence, in ascending order, the lengths of the perimeters are P, Q, R.

Solution to the Break time Teaser:

E The correct answer is a multiple of both 3 and 8, as 24 = 3 × 8. Although 100 is a multiple of 4, it is not a multiple of 8. Therefore even multiples of 100 are multiples of 8, but odd multiples are not. This leaves 200, 400 and 600, but of these only 600 is also a multiple of 3. Hence the only option which is a multiple of 24 is 600.
