## Theme of the Week – Joy

Bishop David, our Bishop, has emphasized the term <u>'Mission'</u> for Northampton Diocese. *"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations"* (Matthew 28:19) This being when he said *"We need to build communities of missionary discipleship around the diocese. These should be able to access oases of refreshment, renewal, and nourishment"*. In order to do this, to be <u>Missionary</u> disciples, we need to know the need for forgiveness and can confidently approach Jesus knowing that his mercy is freely available to us through his death on the cross and rising to life. <u>Missionary</u> disciples are Spirit-filled, relying on the power of the Holy Spirit in their daily lives. <u>Missionary</u> disciples are outward looking, always seeking opportunities to serve and help others in word and deed both within the Christian community and outside of it. <u>Missionary</u> disciples give generously of themselves and of what they have to others. <u>Missionary</u> disciples are fruitful; they display the fruits of the Spirit in their lives: *'love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.'* (Galatians 5:22–23)

In the Gospel on Sunday, John the Baptist outlines his purpose and <u>mission</u>. We pray that we can be more like John; sure, of the path that God wants us to walk and to carry out his <u>mission</u> through us. If we are not sure of our <u>mission</u> or may have strayed away from it, what better time than in Advent to find the path once more and set our feet back on it with renewed resolve.

In the Gospel, John the Baptist explains that he is not the Light but a witness to the Light. The Light being the revelation of God. In Christ, we see clearly who God is and where we should follow to be true people of God. John, the writer of the Gospel, makes sure that John the Baptist is made subordinate to Christ and he does this through John's own words. *"I am not the Messiah… 'But there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap."* 


The readings on Sunday speak of being sent, of being full of the spirit of God, of responding to that spirit with action and **joyful** hearts. The psalm on Sunday speaks of God as having done great things for us. It speaks of a merciful God who redresses the imbalance between rich and poor, advantaged and disadvantaged, the mighty and the lowly. The 1<sup>st</sup> reading from Isaiah tells us how we are to respond to the coming of God into our lives. It is like a song of **joy**, a hymn of rejoicing. We have been called by our baptism and we in turn are to give the good news of God's message to whomever we meet. We are to respond with **joy**.

The single pink candle of Advent that we light today, reminds us of the pink sky before sunrise that a new day is almost upon us. The waiting that is this Advent time reminds us that we are but awaiting the day when in time Jesus will come again in glory.

So as we break for our Christmas holiday let us make it our Mission to bring Joy to those around us.

Thank you for all your support with our Christmas hamper appeal. Your generosity will bring joy to a family most in need. Please spend this holiday thinking of others and where possible do something that can bring Joy to a family member, a friend or better still someone you don't know and least expects it. What greater gift can you give someone but Joy!

We are excited to propose a school trip to Windsor Castle to support our medieval curriculum and to enhance local studies for our Year 7 students. There are 45 spaces available which are offered on a first come first served basis. However, please note that should students demonstrate poor behaviour in the run up to the trip, they will be prohibited from attending. Below are the key details of this trip:

Travel by coach

Departs St. Joseph's at 9.30am

Departs Windsor Castle at 2.00 pm

Returns to St. Joseph's at approximately 2.30pm (traffic dependent)

The cost is £15.00 per pupil. This price covers bus, entrance to the castle and learning session. This is available to pay through ParentPay.

Over the course of the day, students will have the opportunity to explore the castle, learn how it developed over time and will attend a learning session entitled "1066. What happened next?" Students need to wear their school uniform.

Students need to bring their lunch with them. However, Free School Meals will be provided to the relevant students on the day.



### **Science Club**


Spectacular display of flame colours done by students to explore the different colours that each metal ion produces.



## Solution to last Week's Puzzler

B Since VWXYZ is a pentagon, the sum of its interior angles is 540°. Now ∠ZVW is an interior angle of a regular pentagon and so is 108°. Both ∠VWX and ∠XYZ are 90°; and the reflex angle ∠YZV = 90° + 108°. Therefore 540° = 108° + 90° + 90° + 90° + 108° + x°. Hence x = 540 - 486 = 54.



## Solution to the Break time Teaser:

**D** The sum of the interior angles of a quadrilateral is  $360^{\circ}$ . So the smallest angle in the quadrilateral is  $3 \times \frac{360^{\circ}}{3+4+5+6} = 60^{\circ}$  and the largest angle is  $6 \times \frac{360^{\circ}}{3+4+5+6} = 120^{\circ}$ . Hence the required difference is  $60^{\circ}$ .


