From The Head Teacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a busy but purpose filled first half term concluding with the APR meetings today. Thank you for all the generosity with which you have engaged with this and the feedback form which we keep trying to make things better. The time in which parents give to support the school is always humbling and we could not do what we do without your support. Thank you.

It has been a term where once again, we have had to be reactive to the national picture around Covid where a level of responsive agility has been required within a 'live' situation that has influenced staff and students extracurricular activities, which we otherwise would not have wished. Again thank you for your support in making this happen in such fluid manner. By all accounts, this could the ongoing reality for the next 3 years and it is a state of being we are all going to have to become accustomed. We have been led to believe that a large enough

take up of vaccines might help the day-to-day experience of the students return to normal and ease disruption; otherwise, our experience towards the end of this term looks increasingly likely to remain the norm for some time as we head into winter. We will keep you up to date through this Newsletter, as we have done in the past as things evolve.

Vaccinations on 1st November

We have had a number of queries from parents and students around the issue of whether they can receive the jab either after having Covid or if they have felt the symptoms of Covid. After getting in contact with them, the NHS have provided a point of contact – *Emma Siddons* - who can be contacted on 07880541699 or <u>Emma.Siddons@berkshire.nhs.uk</u> for all questions concerning covid or jab related.

Please do not forget that due to the sheer enormity of the programme they have had to shut down the electronic consent form system an additional 48 hours prior to any planned session date to allow the clinical team to safely administer. **Parent's and Carer's deadline to provide consent has been extended until 12pm Wednesday 27th October.** Please be aware that the school immunisation team are currently **unable to book any** catch up clinics for **COVID-19**.

We've bookings in advance for educational trips next year (for example the Battlefields trip) and we need to let you know at this point that currently many *travel companies are not insuring students* who will not have been or who are vaccinated. That means they will not be able to go on these trips.

Keeping in contact with us around illness over half term.

We will be re-assessing the situation to see whether we need to continue with the restrictive measures we either self-imposed and/or those which were undertaken upon advice and guidance by the Health Security Agency when the students come back after the half term. To this end, please do inform us via <u>cv19@st-jo-sephs.slough.sch.uk</u> if your child has a positive LAT flow test and / or a positive PCR test over the half term, as it will help us with the planning for the first week back.

Movement of dates for Parents' evenings and PPE1 (mock exams 1)

Finally, the Covid situation meant a fair deal of absence over the last couple of weeks and a fair bit of disruption to the quantity of teaching and learning across the school. Together with the vaccinations on site being set on 1st November we've taken the decision to push the first set of Pre-Public Exams back to start on the 15th November (for 2 weeks). The knock on effect of this is that the children's performance data we would use to inform discussions with you on Parents' evenings will also be 2 weeks later. Therefore **Parents Evening for the Sixth Form has been moved to January 6th and Year 11 Parents evening moved to the 13th January 2022.**

Student Cycling

Finally, thank you to all the parents and students who supported us trying to keep the children safe on the road by kitting them out with safety equipment. We've ordered over 70 sets of equipment for the children following feedback from local residents and passing drivers who regularly informed us of close shaves with children cycling (not all were from our school!) and the odd bumped student. Already ordered, the lights and helmets should arrive after half term. We are looking into how we can provide some kind of training for them on how to ride cycles safely in the future. If anyone is aware of any successful schemes that have proven successful - we would like to know (please contact <u>r.dann@st-josephs.slough.sch.uk</u>).

Have a great break – we are looking forward to seeing the students back again bright eyed and bushy tailed on 1^{st} November.

Theme of the Week

All Saints

We begin our week reflecting on the lives of all the saints as we celebrate the solemnity of All Saints day. We talk about the saints quite a bit in school, especially with our house saints such as St Teresa and St Jerome, as well as St Joseph. But have we given much thought and reflection to what or who a saint is? A saint is someone who has lived an ordinary life in an extraordinary way, trying his or her best to be a follower of Jesus. For some they have served the poor, others have been great teachers, others have set an example for caring for others or for bringing peace to troubled parts of our world, and some have even died for their faith, for love of Jesus and His Church. These people are now living in Heaven with God. We are all called to be saints. The Gospel today helps us to reflect on what it means to be a follower of Jesus in the words of the Beatitudes.

Which one speaks to you the most?

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you." (Matthew 5:1-12)

One of the Beatitudes is; "Blessed are the peacemakers".

What does it mean to be a peacemaker? It is to think about how to act and react in different situations; to not fight back and to do things with love and gentleness.

How can you be a peacemaker today?

Pope Francis created his own Beatitudes which help us to reflect on the way we live our lives in the 21st Century. They are:

"Blessed are those who remain faithful while enduring evils inflicted on them by others and forgive them from their heart.

"Blessed are those who look into the eyes of the abandoned and marginalised and show them their closeness.

"Blessed are those who see God in every person and strive to make others also discover him.

"Blessed are those who protect and care for our common home.

"Blessed are those who renounce their own comfort in order to help others.

"Blessed are those who pray and work for full communion between Christians."

Which one of Pope Francis' Beatitudes challenges you?

Jesus says in the Gospel; "Rejoice and be glad". He is talking about those times when it is difficult be a witness and to show our faith. We are able to openly be people of faith within our school community, but in other places around the world, people are persecuted for their faith. Many of our saints are martyrs, they died for their faith, never giving up on their belief in Jesus.

Let us pray today for all people of faith, that they may be filled with courage, hope and joy.





Solution to last Week's Puzzler

D In the diagram, *O* is the centre of the lower semicircle, *A* and *C* are the points of intersection of the two semicircles and *B* is the point at the centre of the rectangle and also of the overlap. Now *OA* is a radius of the semicircle so *OA* has length 5 cm. Also *OB* is half the height of the rectangle so has length 4 cm. Angle *ABO* is a right angle. So triangle *ABO* is a (3, 4, 5) triangle and hence $AC = 2 \times 3$ cm = 6 cm.



Solution to the Break time Teaser:

C Bertie travelled 5.5 m in 19.6 s, which is just less than one-third of a minute. So his average speed was approximately 16.5 m per minute, which is equal to 990 m in one hour, as 16.5 × 60 = 990. Now 990 m = 0.99 km, so Bertie's approximate average speed was 1 km per hour.
