As a community we're back with a bang and we need to celebrate it. We've made a temporary change to the uniform for one year and one year only! Pope Francis declared this **the Year of St Joseph** in December 2020. We haven't had the chance to get together to celebrate this due to 3 and a half months of lockdown. Today was the first time we could get together in the Easter Liturgies (in year bubbles) and mark it as a community. As it's a once in a life time celebration, we've marked it by giving the students a one off tie to be used for this year until December only. With the school colours striped on a gold background, together with the school crest, year and citation of 'The Year of St Joseph' we all really hope the students in 20 years' time will still hold onto it as a one off memento of the school history. We'll also mark out the Feast of St Joseph (Saturday 1st May) on Friday 30th April with a celebratory day where we'll hold a day of activities for all the students including the much anticipated ice rink that was robbed by Covid from us at Christmas. We've a few activities in the community planned for later this year – do watch this space.

GCSE, Cambridge Nationals, BTEC, EPQ and A Level Grading Update

Yesterday we received the pre-release material for assessment at these levels. We'll be working at it over the holiday and have it all in place for when the students return after Easter. We'll keep you in loop with everything we'll do.

Free School Meals over the Easter holiday

For all those eligible we'll ensure that Free School Meals over the Easter holiday are kept running – we'll ensure that the usual cash amount is paid by Tesco voucher (bar code scan) via the student St Joseph's email over the Easter break. We hope this helps.

Home based self test Covid Kits

We'll re-order more self test kits for the students' return after Easter and distribute them accordingly. Meanwhile the department of Education has issued a new *Re-introduction of confirmatory polymerase chain reaction (PCR) testing for positive lateral flow device (LFD) tests at assisted testing sites* yesterday. NHS *Test and Trace* is reintroducing confirmatory PCR testing for positive LFD tests conducted at all assisted testing sites, including schools and colleges. This means that all staff, pupils and students who get a positive LFD test, whether at home or supervised at their school or college, should get a confirmatory PCR. The PCR test should be booked immediately either <u>online</u> or by calling 119 and should be undertaken within 2 days.

We'll see all the students back on the 19th April ready and rearing to go. In the meantime, enjoy the Easter break.

We are also offering Easter intervention sessions during the holidays in some subjects. Your son/daughter will have been informed of this and whether their attendance is required for a specific subject.

Year 7 – 10 and Year 12 Reports

Reports for Year 7-10 and 12 will be sent out to parents after the Easter Holidays. Your child's teacher for each subject has assessed their progress in lockdown and these will be marked over the Easter Holidays. D	As $PQ = PR$, $\angle PRQ = \angle PQR = x^{\circ}$. Also, as		
	$PR = PS, \angle PRS = \angle PSR = x^{\circ}$. Therefore,		
	$\angle QRS = (2x)^\circ$. The sum of the interior angles of		
	quadrilateral PQRS is 360°. Therefore		
	x + x + 2x + x = 360, so $5x = 360$. Hence $x = 72$.
