Solution to last Week's Puzzler

The pattern is that your answer will always be $4 \times \text{your initial number.}$

I can prove this because:

In the 3 times table: x = the number you times by 3.

e.g. If x=1, chosen number [in the 3 times table] is 3, If x=2, chosen number is 6

The numbers in the sequence are

$$(3x-1), 3x, (3x+1)$$

Dear Year 8,


