# From The Head Teacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

You'll be pleased to know that the first set of sampling of GCSE and A Level procedures from the Examination Boards has already taken place in the Science department and we've passed with flying colours. ### Theme of the Week – Faith That Grows

We may be familiar with the account in Matthew's Gospel, where we are told that if we have faith even as small as a mustard seed, we can move mountains. On Sunday we hear Mark talk about the same seed, but in a slightly different way.

In Sunday's Gospel we are given two images of what the Kingdom of God is like. Jesus tells his followers that it is like seeds scattered and sown; they start small, but then they grow until they can be harvested. The mustard seed is mentioned too, and Mark emphasises that although it may be the smallest seed to fall into the soil, it grows into the biggest shrub; so big in fact that its branches provide shade for 'the birds of the air'. The mention of birds finding shelter in the branches of the mustard tree is probably the influence of Ezekiel - Mark writing for a non-Jewish audience would appreciate the reference to all nations finding a place in the kingdom. Note also that the phrase "birds of the air" was a traditional Jewish expression for the Gentiles - all the non-Jewish people.

This Gospel passage is so encouraging for each of us. Jesus is trying to help us understand that our faith does not need to be solid, strong and mighty in order to produce goodness. Our faith can be small, fragile, perhaps even feel inferior to those around us. It does not matter. **Our faith in God has the potential to grow and be life-giving to others.** Yes, it needs help and it needs nurturing – but if we rely on the word of God and practise our faith (however small) in whatever way we can, it will grow, and in turn, help bring God's Kingdom into fruition here on earth. So how can we do this?

Perhaps we might **ask more questions about God**, or try to seek more meaning from the Bible, or come to Mass more often.

Perhaps we begin to talk more to God in prayer or seek help from God with the questions in our lives.

Perhaps a verse from scripture hits home with new and deeper meaning.

Perhaps there is a realisation that our lives needs to change.

Perhaps we receive some special kindness from someone in a time of difficulty or sorrow.

How can we help open the hearts of those we encounter to the surprises and small beginnings of God's plan for their lives?

On Tuesday 15th June we will be debating on issues surrounding the Israeli and Palestinian Conflict. All year groups are welcome (although Year bubbles will still apply).


It will happen in T11 from 3:05pm - 4pm.

#### Solution to last Week's Puzzler

C The sum of the exterior angles of a convex polygon equals 360°. The angle marked  $p^{\circ}$  is the exterior angle of a regular pentagon. So  $p = 360 \div 5 = 72$ . The angle sum of a triangle equals  $180^{\circ}$ , so q = 180 - 90 - 72 = 18. The angle marked  $r^{\circ}$  is the interior angle of a regular pentagon, so r = 180 - 72 = 108. The angles marked  $q^{\circ}$ ,  $r^{\circ}$  and  $x^{\circ}$  lie along a straight line, so x = 180 - (q + r) = 180 - (18 + 108) = 54.



#### Solution to the Break time Teaser:


Half of a third, plus a third of a quarter, plus a quarter of a fifth equals  $\frac{1}{6} + \frac{1}{12} + \frac{1}{20} = \frac{10 + 5 + 3}{60} = \frac{18}{60} = \frac{3}{10}.$
