From The Head Teacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

Here's some good news; Jayden Meghoma has earned a place in the England Men's U15's Football Squad. We wish him the very best of luck in his forthcoming squad camp in a few weeks. And congratulations to Collette Cooper who will be returning to the family of St Joseph's as SENDCo, starting in September.

Please do see our Chaplain's notices for our outreach help to the island of St Vincent. One of our staff, Mr Watson, is from the area and he has close contacts there who have asked for our help. As St Joseph was the man who said 'yes', it's right and fitting we should do what we can to help.

Covid Updates

On Monday 10 May the Prime Minister announced that that the country will move to Step 3 of the roadmap on Monday 17 May.

What this means for us at St Joseph's.

Overnight stays will be permitted, which means that schools will be able to organise trips with overnight stays from Monday 17 May. This means the offer of a residential at Eton (run by the school and staff) can go ahead. We're looking for 4 students from Year 10 who would like to attend a residential week at Eton College (all paid for by Eton). If you think your child would benefit from this please ask them to see Ms Cheston by 20th May by the latest (further details are in the Newsletter).

<u>School attendance continues to be mandatory</u> for all pupils and the usual rules on school attendance apply. This includes parents' duty to ensure their child regularly attends school, and schools' and local authorities' ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices, for poor attendance.

The wearing of masks is now:

- Not essential from Monday 17th in classes or in corridors for students. However, we will need to remain alert to the local situation. Students can continue to wear masks around the school and in classrooms if they wish.
- Essential on public transport including the school bus.
- Essential for staff outside of classes where social distancing is not possible (for example, when in communal areas and moving around in corridors).

Although at a National level masks are now not recommended, it's possible that local areas may require students and staff to wear masks if, for example, local variants are discovered or there is a rapid rise in reported cases. We speak with Slough Borough Council weekly to this end and they are very much 'on the ball' with what's happening.

<u>All other efforts to minimalise the risk of infection will remain in place</u>. We will be required to keep all the other measures we have in place such as washing of hands, social distancing, maintaining year group bubbles, staggered finishes, use of sanitisers, keeping windows open, one way systems etc.

Theme of the Week – Truth

Truth is the theme for this week, which links in very well with the word 'truthful' from the St Joseph's Pupil Profile, one of the words for this half term. In the Gospel, Jesus says; "Your word is truth". The word of God, the words Jesus receives from the Father is all truth. Jesus wants us to trust in God's word because it is through His word that we receive true life. In this Gospel from St John, Jesus is in dialogue with God the Father. Jesus speaks the truth about wanting us to be kept safe, to be protected and to not be lost. God loves each of us and we hear this in these words of Jesus. We belong to Him; we are children of God.

What does the word 'truth' mean to you? What examples can you think of when we talk about the 'truth'?

How does it make you feel knowing that you are a child of God?

The words of Jesus in this Gospel are often known as the 'priestly prayer of Christ'. He is offering everything to the Father, giving all that He has done within His ministry to God the Father, giving the Glory to Him. This is the example we must also follow, giving of ourselves to God and giving the glory to God. One of the words that Jesus says in the Gospel is 'consecrate'. He says it twice in this passage of scripture. What does this word mean? It means to set aside for God, set aside for holiness, to be holy. At baptism, we are all consecrated as sons and daughters of God. But what does it mean to be holy?

To be holy is to try to live our lives with God at the centre of all we do. St Teresa of Calcutta said; "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love".

What small things can you do today with great love?

Amazing opportunity at Eton College for Year 10 students-Summer 2021

Eton College has invited 4 Year 10 students from each of the local schools to join them in a new partnership initiative called **'Eton Connect'**.

Eton Connect will be running a new residential summer school for Year 10 students, which will be held at Eton College from **Monday 26th to Friday 30th July 2021**.

The course content is designed to develop young peoples' skills in leadership, confidence, resilience, creative problem solving and collaboration.

If you would be interested in spending a week at Eton College and have the resilience to cope with a week away from home and you feel you can represent the school with calmness, intelligence and maturity. Academically, as a guide, you should be aiming to achieve grade 5s and 6s at GCSE or better in the majority of your subjects.

Students will arrive for 12pm on Monday and leave after lunch on Friday. Activities are timetabled from 8am to 10pm daily with 24 hour staff support. Each student will have their own room in a single-sex boarding house, though bathrooms will be shared. Eton has organised summer schools for over 40 years and the team has real

expertise in keeping children safe while giving them a wonderful experience. While the course is free, we would ask parents to take responsibility for getting the students to and from Eton at the beginning and end of the course.


