

16th November 2025
33rd week in Ordinary time



A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 21: 5- 19

At that time: While some were speaking of the Temple, how it was adorned with noble stones and offerings, Jesus said, 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when there will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down.' And they asked him, 'Teacher, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when these things are about to take place?' And he said, 'See that you are not led astray. For many will come in my name, saying, "I am he!" and, "The time is at hand!" Do not go after them. And when you hear of wars and tumults, do not be terrified, for these things must first take place, but the end will not be at once.'

Then he said to them, 'Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and pestilences. And there will be terrors and great signs from heaven. But before all this they will lay their hands on you and persecute you, delivering you up to the synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors for my name's sake. This will be your opportunity to bear witness. Settle it, therefore in your minds, not to meditate beforehand how to answer, for I will give you a mouth and wisdom, which none of your adversaries will be able to withstand or contradict. You will be delivered up even by parents and brothers and sisters, and relatives and friends, and some of you they will put to death. You will be hated by all for my name's sake. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your lives.'

Reading and Progress Test Reports

Dear Parent and Guardians,

As part of our commitment to tracking student progress and supporting achievement, all students have recently completed a series of national assessments provided by **GL Assessment**. These assessments help us identify individual learning needs, target support, and inform the curriculum that we provide. They also provide a reliable national benchmark to monitor progress over time. The following tests took place:

- **Year 7** – English, Maths, Science Reading and Spelling,
- **Year 8** – English, Maths and Reading,
- **Year 9** – English, Maths and Reading,
- **Year 10, 11, 12 and 13** – Reading only,

Year 7 have recently been provided with a paper copy of their results and a report for English, Maths and Science. The results overview letter explains what scores they achieved, what the scores mean and a GCSE predictor for English, Maths and Science. They have also received a GCSE English Language prediction based on their Spelling and Reading tests. The predictions are worked out based on the historical data that GL has regarding students who have taken the test historically, the scores they got and what they went on to achieve at GCSE. This is a good indication of the current trajectory that your son or daughter is on and the report provides information as to how they can make even better progress.

The overview results letter has some information on how to improve reading and spelling because GL do not provide a report for parents, in the same way that they do for English, Maths and Science.

The overview letter provides information as to what the scores (out of 141) mean. If you would like an electronic copy, please do contact our main school office at office@st-josephs.slough.sch.uk.

Overview results letters and parent reports for Year 8 and 9 will be given to students over the coming weeks as well as a reading test result for KS4 and 5 students.

If a student has an N/A as a result, this means they did not sit the test but there will be another opportunity in the summer term.
