From the Gospel of John (17:1-11a)

At that time: Jesus lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, 'Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. And this is eternal life, that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do. And now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had with you before the world existed.

'I have manifested your name to the people whom you gave me out of the world. Yours they were, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything that you have given me is from you. For I have given them the words that you gave me, and they have received them and have come to know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am praying for them. I am not praying for the world but for those whom you have given me, for they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine, and I am glorified in them. And I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you.'

Theme of the Week – Eternal life

What Jesus speaks in the Gospel on Sunday, it is said just before he is arrested and enters his Passion. If you continue to carry on reading Chapter 17 it finishes with “I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be with them and I in them” Chapter 17 of John's Gospel is a beautiful account of Jesus illustrating what he was sent for; to show love and an abundance of it. An overflowing love that will never stop and is of service to others. In the glorification of Jesus, this is not asked for or done for self-interest, it is for all to follow Jesus so we can come to the Father and receive eternal life. And all of this is said, just before his Passion.

If again we reflect on the last part of Chapter 17, ‘that the love with which you have loved me may be with them and I in them’, Jesus is within us, in what we think, do and say. All the goodness we do is from Christ. So here is our opportunity to be glorified, for doing good things in the name of Christ. Like Christ we are to show others to the Lord. 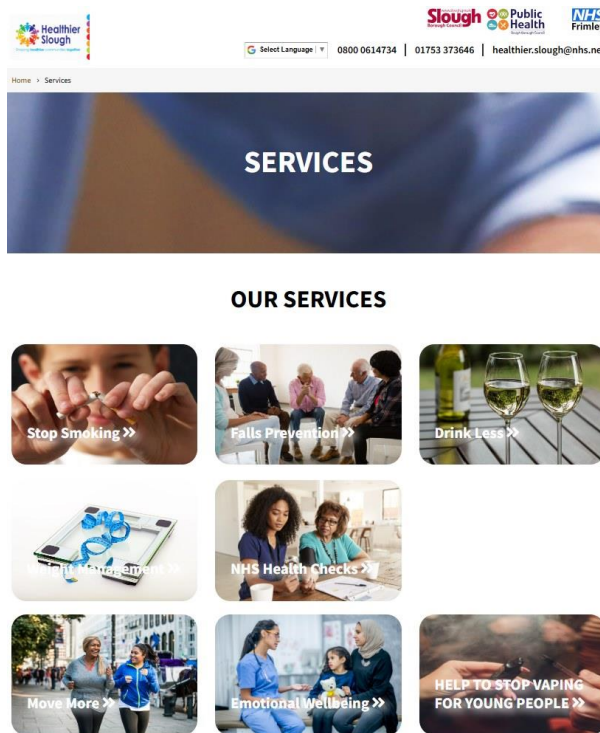

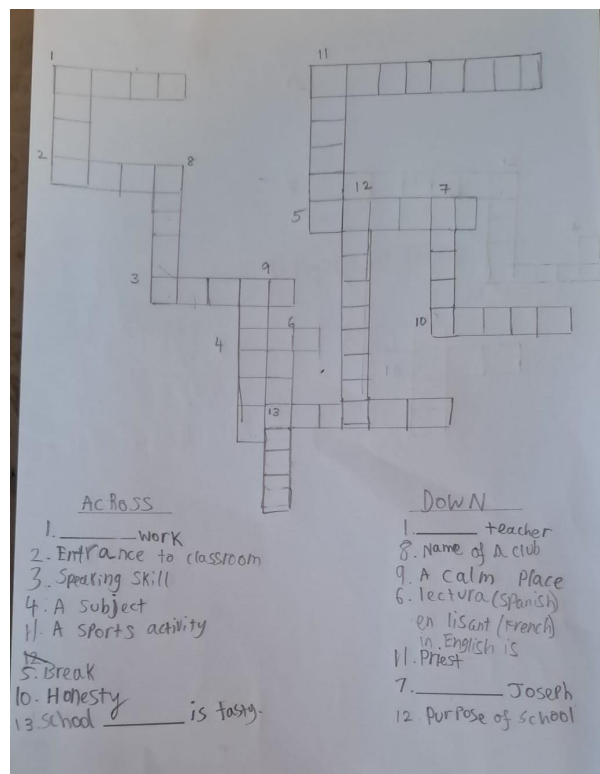

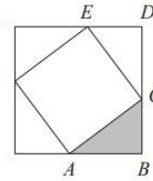

I Can do Maths

Solution to last Week’s Puzzler



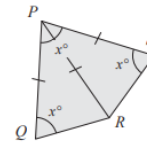
- A** First note that the length of each side of the larger square is 7 cm and that of the smaller square is 5 cm. So their areas are 49 cm^2 and 25 cm^2 respectively. Let $\angle BAC = x^\circ$. As the interior angles of a triangle sum to 180° and $\angle ABC = 90^\circ$, $\angle ACB = (180 - 90 - x)^\circ = (90 - x)^\circ$. The angles on a straight line sum to 180° , so $\angle ECD = [180 - 90 - (90 - x)]^\circ = x^\circ$.



Consider triangles ABC and CDE . Note that $\angle BAC = \angle DCE = x^\circ$; $\angle ABC = \angle CDE = 90^\circ$; $AC = CE = 5 \text{ cm}$. Therefore the two triangles are congruent (AAS). By a similar method, it may be shown that all four triangles which lie between the two squares are congruent to each other. So the area of the shaded triangle is $\frac{1}{4}(49 - 25) \text{ cm}^2 = 6 \text{ cm}^2$.

Solution to the Break-time Teaser:

- D** As $PQ = PR$, $\angle PRQ = \angle PQR = x^\circ$. Also, as $PR = PS$, $\angle PRS = \angle PSR = x^\circ$. Therefore, $\angle QRS = (2x)^\circ$. The sum of the interior angles of quadrilateral $PQRS$ is 360° . Therefore $x + x + 2x + x = 360$, so $5x = 360$. Hence $x = 72$.

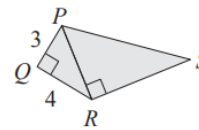


Puzzler of the week
