Grammar Problem of last week - solution

Solution:

I'm sure I just saw Mr Hall running back <u>there</u> in the woods.

In the first sentence, the possessive pronoun 'their' is used, instead of the adverb 'there', denoting where the student was running.

Grammar Problem of this Week

Suffixes and Prefixes – some suffixes come with pesky rules that you need to know.

A suffix is a letter or word that goes on the end of a root word. The suffix changes the root word's meaning e.g. add the suffix 'er to the root word 'garden', to form a new word 'gardener', which now has a new meaning.

However, there are some spelling rules for suffixes. What is the rule can you draw from the examples below?

Our sixth form look very smart generally but addressing these items will ensure that our students are well prepared for the world of work. I thank you for your assistance.



Solution to last Week's Puzzler

D Let the length of the side of the regular hexagon be *a*. Then its perimeter is 6*a*. Therefore the perimeter of the equilateral triangle is also 6*a*, so the length of each of its



sides is 2*a*. The diagrams show that the equilateral triangle may be divided up into 4 equilateral triangles of side *a*, whereas the regular hexagon may be divided into 6 such triangles. So the required ratio is 4: 6 = 2: 3.

Solution to the Break time Teaser:

E Half of a third, plus a third of a quarter, plus a quarter of a fifth equals $\frac{1}{6} + \frac{1}{12} + \frac{1}{20} = \frac{10 + 5 + 3}{60} = \frac{18}{60} = \frac{3}{10}.$
