Weekly Reflections 8th June 2025 10th week in Ordinary time





From the Gospel of John (John 14:15-16, 23b-26)

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, 'If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you for ever. If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words. And the word that you hear is not mine but the Father's who sent me.

'These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.'

Catholic Social Teaching - Stewardship

"The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it." Genesis 2:15. We are guardians of God's creation, living sustainably and enhancing the wellbeing of our planet. Caring for the earth is integral to our task of tackling the scandal of global poverty, vulnerability, inequality, injustice and exclusion. Stewardship is all about caring for the many gifts that God has given to us. These include our environment, our own talents and other resources. The late Pope Francis said "Humanity still has the ability to work together in building our common home" Laudato Si' 13 and "...the world we have received also belongs to those who will follow us."

Theme of the Week - Pentecost

Happy Birthday! Pentecost is the day the Catholic Church celebrates its birthday. It marks the day where the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles to go out and help them fulfil the mission of Jesus. On Sunday, parishes around the world had the option to hear from either John 20:19-23 or John 14:15-16, 23b-26. In John Chapter 20, we hear the disciples (the Greek word for disciple means learner and refers to someone who believed and followed Jesus) locking themselves in a room in fear. Jesus then appears to them and after saying "Peace be with you" he then breathes on them saying "Receive the Holy Spirit...." From here they are then sent (The Greek word for Apostle literally means to be sent) on their mission to bring Christ to others. We celebrate Pentecost as the Church's birthday as it marks the start of the Church to which we are members of. When then we too receive the Holy Spirit, first at our Baptism, and then at Confirmation, we too should remember that we are on a mission to bring Christ to others.

Pentecost was a Jewish feast day celebrated fifty days after Passover. This is why so many were in Jerusalem at the time that the Holy Spirit was manifested in the lives of the disciples. It might be expected that the absence of Jesus would have led to the newly formed gathering of believers to collapse and dissipate, and we know from Scripture that at least some of them had left Jerusalem to return to their homes. Jesus appears among them offering his greeting of peace and the opportunity to confirm his presence by examining his wounds. The conferring of the Holy Spirit is intimate, as Jesus breathes life back into his fearful disciples. The disciples are to go out and continue Jesus' work of forgiveness, love and witness in the world. And it is from the other Gospel reading on Sunday where Jesus tells us that the Holy Spirit will teach them new things, lead them to a deeper understanding into the mystery of Jesus and help them to understand the things to come as they take up the challenges that lie ahead. When we are Baptised and Confirmed, we too receive and should listen to the Holy Spirit within us; so it can teach us to understand the mystery of Jesus and take up the challenges that lie ahead of us.

Coming to faith is a journey for most of us as we discover God's existence within the realities of our life experiences. Just as the disciples gathered together to pray when they were anxious, it is important for us to gather within our school community to share the highs and the lows of our journey. Regular time to pray alone, to pray in community and time to listen to God within our hearts will give us that sense of guidance. Fear had caused the disciples to lock themselves away. When Jesus appeared and breathed the Holy Spirit into his friends, this experience was totally life changing. It led to the start of the Church, and 2000 years or so later we still are here. How can you be more **Attentive** and **Discerning** in listening to God through the Holy Spirit? What fruits of the spirit manifest in you and how can you be more **Active** and **Curious** to share these with others?

GCSE Polish Prep Elective and Exam-Only Route

Following the successful implementation of the Polish GCSE preparation elective, we are pleased to confirm that we will continue supporting our students in the 2025–2026 academic year.

Please note that <u>only students in Year 10 and Year 11</u> (current Year 9 and Year 10 students) are eligible to join the elective and/or sit the exams. Applications from students in lower year groups will not be considered at this time.

Important Reminder: The elective is designed for students who are already proficient in the Polish language. Its focus is on exam practice and preparation.

For the elective, students will be split into two groups:

Group 1: September – December

Group 2: January - May half-term

Details of group allocations will be provided in September.

Year 10 Biology Trip to Harcourt Arboretum

On Wednesday 4th June, the Year 10 Biology students went on a field trip to Harcourt Arboretum, outside Nuneham Courtenay near Oxford.

The group applied their knowledge of sampling in a wild-flower meadow full of spring blooms and learned the names of several common wild flowers. Pupils were able to explore the grounds, learn more about the rare trees in the collection, and identify ancient relatives of pine trees (Gymnosperms) from around the world. They also had several peacock encounters! The trip had direct relevance to the ecology section of the Biology specification and provided students with depth and breadth of knowledge that will help them in the future.



Water Sports Trip

On Thursday 5th June, a group of our students took part in a communication and team-building morning, run by the Thames Valley Learning Partnership (TVLP), at Dorney Lake, Windsor. Solution to last Week's Puzzler

E As PQST is a square, SQ = TS. Also, as triangle QRS is equilateral, SQ = SR. Therefore STR is an isosceles triangle in which TS = SR. So $\angle TRS = \angle STR = ((180 - 90 - 60) \div 2)^\circ = 15^\circ$. Similarly, $\angle PRQ = 15^\circ$. Hence $\angle PRT = (60 - 2 \times 15)^\circ = 30^\circ$.




Do You Know?




SCHOOL CLUBS
