

# Year 11 History Map

## British Sector of the Western Front

Students will aim to answer the following enquiries:

1. How to use sources and ask appropriate questions in their enquiry into medicine in the British Sector of the Western Front?
2. How did the developments in medicine in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century contribute to the treatment of soldiers in the British Sector?
3. What were the different developments in surgery and medicine used to treat soldiers on the British Sector



## Medieval Medicine, c. 1250 – c.2500

Students will aim to answer the following enquiries:

1. What did people believe caused disease?
2. What methods did medieval people try in order to prevent and treat disease?
3. What were the approaches to the causes treatment and prevention of the Black Death?



## Renaissance Medicine, c.1500 – c. 1700

Students will aim to answer the following enquiries:

1. What ideas did people have about the causes of disease and illness in Renaissance England?
2. How did people try to prevent and treat disease and illness during Renaissance times?



## Revision

Students will use this time to extend and consolidate their knowledge and historical skills.



## Medicine in the 20<sup>th</sup> century

Students will aim to answer the following enquiries:

1. What changes are there in the understanding of the causes of disease and illness since 1900?
2. What changes are there in treatment of illness and disease since 1900?
3. What are the changes in the medical treatment brought about by the introduction of the NHS and improvement in science and technology?
4. What new approaches are there to the prevention of disease in the 20<sup>th</sup> century?
5. How was penicillin discovered and developed?



## Medicine in the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries

Students will aim to answer the following enquiries:

1. What ideas did people in Britain have about the causes of disease and illness in Britain c.1700 – c.1900, and how did these change from previous periods?
2. What impact did Pasteur and Koch have on people's understanding of the causes of disease and illness?
3. How did people attempt to prevent disease including vaccinations about the work of Edward Jenner, government action, and the work of John Snow?
