




Knowledge is a Schema (a finished jigsaw)



- A secure knowledge base of the subject that can be recalled fluently (Curriculum Maps, Textbooks and Personalised Learning Checklist).
- ✓ Depth and breadth of the subject that transcends topics, the specification and makes links (the Super Curriculum).
- Application of these skills in familiar and unfamiliar contexts/scenarios (Revision guides, Exam Questions and Past Papers).





Step 1: Take Book

Step 2: Identify Key Term/Knowledge

Step 3: Ask the student to recall it

Step 4: Listen to response

Step 5: If they get it wrong give them the book and let them read the answer – getting it wrong doesn't matter (rehearsal).

Step 6: Repeat and Rehearse







UCAS – Key Dates

- 17 May 2022 UCAS opens
- 6th of September UCAS applications may be submitted for Entry 2023.
- 15th of October Medicine, Vet and Dental applications to be sent.
- 25th of January all UCAS applications submitted
- 18th of May (generally) deadline to make firm (aspirational) and insurance (back up) choices.
- 18th of August A-Level Results Day


The Application

- You will choose a maximum of 5 courses
 - Some choice restrictions:
 - Medicine, Veterinary and Dentistry max of 4 choices
 - Oxford or Cambridge you can only apply for one course at one or the other.
- UCAS operates an invisibility policy this means that each university that you apply to can't see which other institutions has also received an application from you.
- Payment of £26 to apply made online by card.
- You can only send one UCAS application in each year's cycle.



- Critically important part of your UCAS application.

- Passion & academic suitability this is critical.
- Evidence of the very highest level of independent study.

Student Finance



Two Types of Costs to Consider:

- Tuition Fees (up to £9,250 for UK residents, currently including)
- Living Costs (rent, food, bills, travel, books & resources etc.)





Application is completed online: <u>https://www.gov.uk/apply-online-for-student-finance</u>

EU students - support remains the same. You may be eligible for help with your living costs if both the following apply:

- You've lived in the UK for more than 3 years before the first day of the first academic year of your course.
- You have settled status.

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- **Tuition Loan** (covers the annual cost of a degree and paid direct to the university)

Student Loans

- Maintenance Loan (cost of living such as accommodation, food, course materials and is paid directly into your child's bank account. This is influenced by parental earnings I.e. it is means-tested).

Additional Support



- Learning Needs (DSA EHCP will lapse before university).
- Bursaries and Scholarships (automatically applied by the university based on the student loan application).
